PAOLO CALIARI was born in Verona, hence he was known by the name *Veronese*. He studied with Antonio Badile while living in Verona, before moving to Venice in about 1553. With Titian and Tintoretto, Veronese dominated the Venetian art scene. His use of color differed from that of other painters of the Venetian school, and hints of his training in Verona can be seen in his distinctive yet harmonious coloring.

Veronese often painted religious scenes, placing them in an incongruous Venetian setting with the saints dressed in finery and jewels. Although he was censored for this decorative element which some viewed as sacrilegious, it enabled him to portray the splendor of life in the rich and triumphant city state of Venice.

During the early years of his career in Venice, Veronese painted frescoes for the great architect Sanmicheli. As a result, many of his works convey a lasting impression of the detail of architecture, including "The Marriage Feast at Cana", where the feast takes place against a magnificent backdrop of sweeping Classical colonnades. The architectural setting intensifies the illusion that the painting is a scene from a play - sixteenth-century theaters often had two such flanking flights of stairs. Veronese has included a self portrait of himself playing the *viola da braccio*; beside him are fellow artists Titian and Tintoretto. # What do I bring?

An Article on Attending a Tournament by Mistress Bridget Lucia MacKenzie

o you have found out there is going to be an SCA Tournament, and you want to go! You know what day and what the address is. Here are some hints to help you fit in and have a fun day. First you need to gather your stuff to attend!

#### **GARB**

In the SCA we ask that folks make a "reasonable attempt at Period Garb". "Garb" is the costume of an earlier time, our SCA time "Period" is about 400 to 1600 CE (Common Era). There are many places on the Internet and in libraries which show what clothing people wore in times past. The simplest attire can be inexpensively assembled from thrift clothing racks, includina peasant shirts and simple boots. Perhaps that brown pair of pants or skirt in the back of your closet. The Chatelaine (Officer in charge of welcoming and educating people) will have Loaner Garb that you can wear for the day. Contact them IN ADVANCE of the event so they can bring it.

#### **CHAIR**

A tournament is most often held in a park, which will not have anywhere

to sit. Bring a chair that you can sit on during Court, under a pavilion, and while watching the various activities. If you have a director's chair or other wooden folding chair, great! Otherwise a camp chair or even plastic deck chair is fine as long as you bring some fabric to lay over it. A big sheet or tablecloth will cover most non-period chairs. You can even just drape a cloth over your sturdy cooler and sit on that! (see LUNCH)

#### **LUNCH**

Consider that this is a lovely picnic in the park, and you get to bring your picnic lunch! You can build your own delicious meal of cold chicken wings, potato salad and Jello. Or you can pick up a sandwich from the Subway shop on the way in to the event. Bring all your own utensils, and be sure to clean up after yourself. Some

groups have a potluck share table where folks bring food and share with others in the group who have brought food. Be sure to check with the Chatelaine or the groups leaders to find out the rules in advance so you don't find yourself starving. Some folks bring a cooler to keep foods and drinks frosty cold, but be sure to hide it under a table or large cloth. Your cooler can even double as your chair if you toss a cloth over it. Be sure to bring and drink plenty of water, dehydration is a concern, especially during hot summer days. Again, the group you are hanging out with may offer water, again, check with those in charge to see what their rules are. Most tournaments are listed in the announcement as 'Dry" which means NO ALCOHOL, in which case, please

do not bring any alcoholic beverages to the site.

#### **YOUR QUESTIONS !!!**

This is an excellent time for you ask questions about the SCA! Chances are if one person does not know the answer, they can lead you to someone else who does. Ask people about their garb, their armor, the handicraft they are working on, and likely they will be glad to talk to you about it! Hopefully their answers will help you decide what your next project or event will be!


