And if you have feedback on how to make this newsletter better, feel free to contact me as well. I'm easy to reach at chronicler@sca-altavia.org.



Submission Guidelines: Just do it! (chronicler@sca-altavia.org.)



For the last several months, The Society has been considering submitted names and arms under two sets of rules. (This 'phase-in' period will end with the October Laurel meeting.)

Laurel produces some numbers of what has passed, and under which rules. I thought it would be interesting to compare these to other results from prior years.

The first set is the results of a meeting held in June 1979 to clear up a large backlog of names and arms that had accumulated. The meeting has been dubbed 'Heraldicon'. This may not be a typical meeting, but it's the earliest set of figures I could find. After this meeting, an early set of rules were put into use while Wilhelm von Schluessel was Laurel. He apparently did not have a phase in period for the new rules - he just expected them to be used after a certain date.

In 1989, the Rules for Submission (RfS) were put in place. These are essentially the rules that have been used up until this year. The plan was have a phase-in period from Oct 1989 through April 1990.

Following the procedures outlined above, the results of the meeting were as follows:

Passed under both sets of rules: 414 (203 name, 211 armorial) Returned under both sets of rules: 67 (25 name, 42 armorial)

Passed under old rules, but not new: 5 (0 name, 3 armorial style, 2 armorial conflict)
Passed under new rules, but not old: 34 (15 name, 7 armorial style, 12 armorial conflict)

Holding names formed: 7 Corrective Actions: 2 Administrative Pends: 5

Excluding the holding names, corrective actions and administrative pends, 525 separate actions were taken. For a better comparison, in calculating the acceptance rate under the two sets of rules, we excluded these administrative categories. We then divided the total number of acceptances by the number of items (525). Using this formula, the acceptance rate under the old rules would have been 79.81%. The acceptance rate under the new rules would have been 85.33%.

July 2012 Laurel Letter (Gabriel Kjotvason)

From Pelican and Wreath: Submissions Analysis for July

During this transition period, we are sharing our counts of the results of considering submissions this month under both the Rules for Submissions and the Standards for Evaluation. These counts include registered or returned items only; no administrative actions such as transfers or acceptances, associations of existing armory, heraldic wills, or other such letters will be included in these counts.

"Armory style" and "armory conflict" indicate if a submitted item could only be passed under one rule set or the other due to conflict or style issues. For example, a submission that could not be registered under the old rules due to conflict but could be registered without conflict under the new standards will be counted as "passed under the new standards, but not old" as armory conflict.

Passed under both sets of rules: 314 total, 163 names, 151 armory Returned under both sets of rules: 35 total, 5 names, 30 armory

Passed under old rules, but not new: 11 total, 6 names, 5 armory style, 0 armory conflict Passed under new rules, but not old: 10 total, 2 names, 0 armory style, 8 armory conflict

If math is not your thing, it may be interesting to note that if all submissions were considered only under the Rules for Submissions, there would be an 87.8% success rate. Considered only under the Standards for Evaluation, there would be an 87.5% success rate.

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Banner Days

A couple months ago a few people from our lovely barony attended a Silk Flag Making Workshop. The class was an all-day outside event at Aston Hall and taught by Baroness Rebecca and Sir Philip. To participate in the class there were some steps that needed to be completed before attending, like designing your flag and transferring the design onto the silk. Designing my flag was super fun! The best part about it was that you could make your flag any shape you want!



Luca and I shared the large piece of silk (the silk is large enough so you can make 2 flags out of it, so two people almost always share a piece of silk) and on the day of the workshop we worked very closely while painting the dye onto the silk. We both chose to put our heraldry on our flags, and chose the "standard" style of medieval flag (the long rectangular-ish shape). The workshop was a lot of fun and they had lots of different colors of dye to paint with. I would recommend this class to anyone who wants to make their own silk flag mostly because it is a ton of fun and it is very affordable! Keep in mind though, that it is an all-day class and requires standing most of the day!

July Baronial Meeting 2012

Opening --

Baronial Comments: Will not be at Festival of the Rose, but will be at Lyondemere Anniversary. Come on up! Great Western War pre-reg closes August 1. Don't forget to do so and get extra footage. If you don't pre-reg, you will not camp with Altavia. Come paint the shed. We have the 2013 Calendar and it will be uploaded to the Altavia Yahoo group for viewing. Going forward, Altavia will be requesting dates for CAID Rapier Open. Looking for an event Steward for 2013 Crown, but they needs to be someone that hasn't run an event in sometime (not the usual suspects, i.e. not someone that attends meetings). Unarmored combat, there are discussions on having it in the barony (i.e. promoting it, teaching it, having it at our practices, etc.). We are looking for someone to teach/mentor Unarmored Combat. It is roughly \$85-\$90 per sword. Tezar and Niko will reach out to various Unarmored fighters to see if they will come to Altavia and teach, helping Secca with researching this option.

NEW BUSINESS

EVENTS:

<u>CAID Rapier Open</u>: Going well. Rapier ropes need to come out. Need to organize pick up. Herald taken care of. Two week out reminder. Not a lot of tents should be brought (4-5). Pavilions ok. Dragon Wing will be brought.

<u>CAID Archery Open</u>: Lyondemere interested in hosting is at our location. Waiting for follow up.

Great Western War: (October 3-8) http://caid-gww.org/ Splitting Privy Duty with Gyldenholt again this year. August 1st is the deadline for pre-reg and for getting your class printed in the GWW gatebook. Please send in classes asap! Even after deadline, feel free to send in classes. If you don't pre-reg for camp, you will NOT camp with the Barony. You have to pre-reg to land allocate. There is going to be a hand fasting 7:30 (Cecelia and Christophe) which will be a roving reception as well

<u>Agincourt</u>: [Lynette] Haven't done anything since last month. No site officially. October 28th possible raffle that day. Might want to reach out to the Roving Rangers to attend.

<u>Yule</u>: [Flaxen Abbey] 1001 Arabian Nights is the theme. Have a date, talked to the church and reserved the date with them as well. Spoke to Jason about the food and got a proposed food: lemon olive chicken, humus, and pita bread. Still discussions about whether the populace will bring side dishes or desserts, etc.

<u>Spring Crown</u>: Needs an event steward and site for the privy council. Niko is looking into his church for it. OFFICERS:

Marshals -

<u>Armored</u>: Practices are still continuing with 5-10 heavies per meeting. Helgi is having a pel practice an hour before hand, which is well attended. Dancing and Rapier is also happening at that meeting (Monday nights). Loaner gear is currently in ok condition, however in the winter there should be a repair night to be scheduled.

August Baronial Meeting 2012

Opening --

<u>Baronial Comments:</u> [Baron] appreciated Niko defending Her Excellency online with the Birthday wishes/birthday discussion on the Yahoo group. If people wish to get a shout out from Her Excellency they need to let her know in advance (email her). Going to Crown, come on down! Also going to Privy Council, so if you have any issues to discuss there for them to bring up, let them know. Belly Dance, Youth combat as well as the culinary guild are going well. There was a request for another Ground Cloth to be made for another project it when over so well.

Equestrian is going down in attendance with all the various members leaving the area (moving) and interest levels waning. Will get with Baronial officer and see what sort of help she needs in order to get more activity for this area of interest. Still trying to get demos and Unarmored Combat going in the Barony and need to find a marshal for Unarmored in order to really get that going. Roisin can help us start unarmored. We will be going to Highland War and would like to know how many people will be there to see what the "prescience" will be like. Great Western War pre-reg closed August 1.

<u>Seneschal:</u> Minutes not printed out and not approved unfortunately. They were uploaded early/on time and are posted on the Yahoo Group. Will make up next month. She will be at Crown (as well as the Barony). She requested that everyone keep their items close to them near the end of the day before it's time to start packing up, so packing up is easier.

Announced that all positions are good on Deputies. If anyone needs a Deputy, they should contact her.

Due to the shade covered tables, most people didn't bother to put their pavilions up, which was good because we could not have fit more than 2 or 3 more small pavilions. A total of 3 pavilions were used, with the baronial Dragonwing for the Royals, Mercy's for the Potters Guild Lunch and Dona Grace & Bert's.

<u>Yule</u>: [Flaxen Abbey] 1001 Arabian Nights is the theme. Paperwork sent in. Theme settled, working on ad and budget. Selene to bring a second main dish an alternative. Recipes will be posted to help membership on the FB page once Monique sends CP write up and Social media can get the page up. Not much room for heating or refrigeration of food at the site, so that needs to be told to the populace. Hold Chess and Bardic champions at this event. Will be using Wolfe's beads for Tokens (Meliora has them).

<u>Spring Crown</u>: Griffin Freehold will be event steward together. There will be a personal heraldry display contest with a possible winner getting a hand silk painted banner class as the prize. Let the Baronesses be the judges. Niko is helping with the Privy council site (using his church's site).

OFFICERS:

<u>Archers</u>: Practices have been small. Ian came down to talk about period archery along with Achillos. A handful of people have come to the event. Christophe bought some arrows at Pennsic. We need quivers.

Arts & Sciences: Not here. No report sent in. She's doing another floor cloth. Check website for the most updated list of classes online. <u>Social Media</u>: Waiting for new CP write ups for Agincourt and Yule. Once she gets those, she will put them up. At this point, all events are done and nothing is up other than the main Altavia page and sub-group pages.

Minster of Children: Please update name. Nothing else to report.

<u>Chirurgeon</u>: Cain not there. Cecelia reported – had to give a Band-Aid to Chris Cogard at practice the day before this meeting.

Constable: All stuff given out. He has not stuff. Cecelia still has a sign that needs to get into his hands.

Exchequer: Not there. No report sent in. We assume we have money.

Herald: Not much to report. Won't be at Crown.

Lists: CAID Rapier Open went well. Nothing else to report.

Marshals -

A Feast During the Time of Chaucer

Whan that Aprille with his shoures sote The droght of Marche hath perced to the rote

Chaucer. The Prologue to the Canterbury Tales

Can we think of April and springtime and not think of Geoffrey Chaucer? *The Canterbury Tales* are full of references to eating and drinking, of courtly manners, and dietary customs. One of main characters is the Cook, whose brief tale began with talk of the "craft of vitailliers."

But what did Chaucer eat when at court? We know in part what the court of Richard II ate because Richard's master cooks left behind a famed treatise on cookery known as the *Forme of Cury*. It's been available in print since 1780, but the best, edited scholarly version came out a generation ago under the title *Curye on Inglysch*. Professors C. B. Hieatt and Sharon Butler did a magnificent job of publishing a number of 14th century texts in that volume, including the *Forme of Cury*. Technology doesn't stand still, however, and print has given way to digital formats. John Rylands University Library, now known as the University of Manchester Library, in England digitized their copy of the *Forme of Cury* and placed it online in 2009. Far less known about than the *Forme of Cury*, we also have the details of a rather splendid wedding banquet that Geoffrey Chaucer probably personally attended in 1368. We say probably because like much of Chaucer's life, it's not exactly known where he was or his activities or the exact dates when something happened, up to and including both his birth and his death. What we do know is Chaucer (circa 1340?-1400?) spent time in the service of the English prince Lionel of Antwerp, Duke of Clarence, the surviving second son of King Edward III. Lionel of Antwerp (1338–1368) was affianced and then married to the rich heiress Elizabeth de Burgh, Countess of Ulster in childhood. Their daughter Philippa was born in 1355 and would grow up to marry the Edmund Mortimer, 3rd Earl of March. (Her great-great grandson would be Edward IV.) It was intended that Duke Lionel should manage the affairs of the Crown in Ireland and his wife's inheritance, and beginning in 1362, he began to do so. Lionel was never particularly interested or adept at managing the Irish, however, and left Ireland permanently in 1366. His wife Elizabeth (born 1332) had passed away in 1363 so another rich marriage was being arranged for the Royal Prince. This time King Edward III looked abroad to far off Italy and arranged the marriage of his second son to Violante, the only daughter of Galeazzo Visconti, Lord of Pavia and Milan. After his so-so career in Ireland, it was hoped Lionel would be able to claim a rich dowry and carve out a career for himself in Italy. The bride is thought to have been as young as 13, although other sources indicate she was perhaps 15.

There's circumstantial evidence that the young Chaucer was part of the company of over 450 men who accompanied Lionel on his trip across France, Savoy, and Italy to meet his bride. It is known that Chaucer was away from England for much of 1368, but was he accompanying Lionel or was he acting on some unknown matter in the service of King Edward III. As a side note, if Chaucer did attend the wedding in the spring of 1368, the question arises about Chaucer meeting the great Italian poet Petrarch at the wedding banquet or sometime else on this Italian trip. Petrarch was seated at

the first table at the feast as an honored guest. It is also known the famed Chronicler of the Hundred Years War, Jean Froissart was present, as was the English mercenary John Hawkwood, who was in service at this time to the bride's uncle Bernabo Visconti.

Following the wedding, which was held in either late May or early June 1368, a most magnificent wedding feast was held in Milan. Although it appears occasionally in other volumes on Chaucer and in works on the 14th century, the best and still most accessible account of the feast appears in **The Last Months of Chaucer's Earliest Patron** by Albert S. Cook. The classic account of the feast by the Italian Paulus Jovius (1483-1552) was recorded long after the event, though no doubt based on now missing or unrecorded "good contemporary authorities." There were also additional accounts of the ostentatious banquet, including descriptions in Corio, the *Annals of Milan*, the *Chronicle of Montferrat*, Aliprando's *Cronica della Cittd di Mantova (Antiquitate's Italicce)* and works identified as *Fragments*. Albert Cook sat down with these accounts and worked to reconcile them to produce his work on Lionel.

The feast may have taken place directly after the wedding or in the evening in the courtyard of the public square, which adjoined the Basilica of Santa Maria Maggiore. There were two tables. Accounts vary as to number of seated guests. Perhaps there were two tables of 50 each or just 57 guests in all or perhaps a table of 50 and a table of 57. (There is also the possibility the male guests were seated by their ladies, so the gentlemen might serve the ladies from the double portion dishes. This is what Cook proposes in one of the numerous footnotes. Or perhaps the men and women were seated at separate tables.) Stow in *Annales* for 1368 writes of "above 30 course of service upon the table..."

In reconciling the accounts Albert Cook came up with this menu:

- 1) The first course was served double for the duke's table meat and fish. There were suckling pigs, gilded, with fire in their mouths; the fish were porcelain-crabs [or perhaps sea-snails, also gilded.
- 2) The second meat course was of hares, gilded; the fish course was of pike, gilded.
- 3) The third meat-course was a large calf, gilded. The fish-course was of trout, gilded.
- 4) The fourth meat-course was of quails and partridges, gilded. The fish-course was of roasted trout, gilded.
- 5) The fifth meat-course was of ducks and herons, gilded. The fish-course was carp, gilded.
- 6) The sixth meat-course was of beef and fat capons with sauce of garlic and vinegar. The fish-course was sturgeons in water.
- 7) The seventh meat-course was of capons and meat [veal?] in lemon sauce. The fish-course was tench [pesce?] in lemon sauce.
- 8) The eighth meat-course was beef pies [with the dough kneaded up with cheese and sugar?] served with cheese. The fish-course was of large eels in pies. [sugared and with good spices.]
- 9) The ninth meat-course was of meat aspic. [with chicken aspic?] The fish-course was of fish aspic.
- 10) The tenth meat-course was meat-galantine. The fish-course was galantine of lampreys.
- (11) The eleventh meat-course was of roasted kids. The fish-course was of roasted garfish.
- 12) The twelfth meat-course was of hares and kids in chive sauce or pickle. The fish-course was of various fish in chive sauce.

- 13) The thirteenth meat-course was of venison and beef in moulds. [with sauce of sugar and lemon.] The fish-course was of fish turned inside-out (?) [perhaps a subtletie?]
- 14) The fourteenth meat-course was of capon and fowls in red sauce and green, with oranges. The fish-course was of tench turned inside-out.
- 15) The fifteenth meat-course was of peacocks, with cabbage, French beans, and pickled ox tongue. The fish-course was of carp.
- 16) The sixteenth meat-course was of roasted rabbits, peacocks, field fares (game birds?) and ducklings. The fish-course was of roasted eels.
- 17) The seventeenth course was of junkets and cheese.
- 18) The eighteenth course was of fruit, including cherries.

Aliprando adds that after the ladies and gentlemen had washed, wine and then confections were served. (Albert Cook, "The Banquet" pp. 66-73.)

Besides the foods, lavish quantities of wine were served. Each course also featured the exchange of costly gifts. For example, the 12th course featured gifts of "six great coursers, with gilded saddles and trimmings, wrought with the arms of Galeazzo and the duke, six lances, six shields, and six [steel] hats gilded...." Other gifts included cloth of gold, twelve sparrow hawks, six falcons, greyhounds, gold and silver plate, cups, and basins, more horses, fat cattle, embroidered furniture, and jewels. And so ends the account of the wedding feast of Duke Lionel and Duchess Violante.

It was a magnificent feast, but a far less successful marriage. Lionel died of a fever on October 17, 1368, less than five months after the wedding. There has always been talk of poison, but as Frances Saunders notes his death was "after a "lingering sickness." The Plantagenets did not have strong stomachs (his brother, the Black *Prince*, would die in 1376 of digestive disorders)." (Saunders, 145) Years later, Lionel's body was transported to England and buried at Clare, in the church of the Augustine Friars in Suffolk, beside the body of his first wife Elizabeth. Violanti would marry twice more and be dead by November 1386.




