Basic Ink Making - A guide

May 25, 2013 I had two different entries for ink making in the Middle Kingdom Arts and Sciences Fair. Both of my entries came in first place. But I started off not having a single clue how to make ink which is where most first time ink makers start at, just like I did.

The first time I ever made ink nobody in the room really knew what we were doing. We had read some books, seen some things, but we didn't know what we were doing by any means. We had a tin coffee can of California Oak Galls, a small medicine bottle of copperas and a desire to make ink. So... we did.

We boiled the oak galls, pulled out the chunks and threw in the copperas. And it turned black! We all stuck our head over it and watched it turn black. And then quickly realized that this was not a wise thing to have done and quickly pulled our heads back. We put a dip pen into the pot and then wrote with it. "INK!" we declared and so we were successful.

Today, I might quibble with my naive self of then, but in essence we were not entirely wrong. We were more enthusiastic than we were knowledgeable, but from enthusiasm for learning comes knowledge. Be enthusiastic and celebrate your triumphs! My journey into making ink has been filled with triumphs and what some might call setbacks.

My hope is that with this post I can give you the tools to have your first triumph and to inspire you to try-umph even more ink making.

So what are the basics of making Iron Gall ink?

Get your ingredients together.

- Water
- Oak Galls
- Copperas (Ferrous Sulfate)
- Gum Arabic.

What kind of water? For your first batch? Any kind of water. I am partial to store bought distilled water myself, but most tap water is just fine.

Where do you get oak galls? You can pick them from oak trees or you can buy them online. If I buy them. I buy Aleppo Oak Galls from John Neal Bookseller.

Copperas can be purchased from some SCA merchants. I purchase mine from Frey Scientific.

Gum Arabic can be purchased at most art supply stores in a clear liquid form. I prefer dry gum arabic, either in crystal or powdered forms. Commercial sellers of dry gum arabic include John Neal Bookseller Kremer Pigments, Natural Pigments and (sometimes) Sinopia.

You might want to keep things a bit small the first time you make Iron Gall Ink, though some people want to go big. Either way is fine, though I'll be talking about a small batch of ink in this post.

AMERICAN MEASUREMENTS:

1 quart of water, 1 oz Aleppo oak galls, 1/2 oz copperas, 1oz dry gum arabic or 2 fluid oz liquid gum arabic (commercial bought)

METRIC:

1 liter of water, 30 grams Aleppo oak galls, 15 grams copperas, 30 grams dry gum arabic or 60 milliliters liquid gum arabic (commercial bought)

In a well-ventilated area... (kitchen with fan, open doors and a fan, park wherever)

Boil your water. As the water boils break up your oak galls. Once the oak galls are broken up put them in the water.

Boil the oak galls until the liquid takes on a dark color preferably a dark coffee color.

Filter out the oak galls. You can do this by pouring it through a sieve, a strainer or, as in period, well woven linen or cheese cloth.

Toss in the copperas and watch everything turn black, a bit like magic.

Add in the gum arabic and stir until everything is liquid.

Congratulations you now have ink! Use it. Store it. Share it!

This first batch of ink should serve you well. Is it the best ink? No. Is it usable ink? Of course. And it should write fairly black as well. Clean your metal nibs after using this ink with water and mild soap.

I have several period recipes available on this blog if you want to read them and try your hand at making those.

The Field of Cloth of Gold

As many Society persons ready themselves to once again go off to the fields of Pennsic, Gulf Wars, or Great Western War, sometimes it's rather interesting to reflect upon the past and see what a meeting between kings entailed in the early sixteenth century. In a field between the English held town of Guînes and the French territory of Ardres in France, King Henry VIII of England and King Francis I of France met in person in 1520 at the meeting that has come to be called the Field of Cloth of Gold or the Field of the Cloth of Gold. Why was it titled as such? The traditional view is that it was named 'Cloth of Gold' because of the rich fabrics and accoutrements, but historian Joycelyne Russell notes the field or valley where the encounters took place had been called the golden vale, val de oro, val dore' or vallis aurea previous to the 1520 meeting.

The event was the result of elaborate staging and diplomacy and was two years in the planning. Each country established its own magnificent camps. Between these two camps in the middle of the valley, the two sides came together for the official pageants, festivities, and activities like the jousting. The Field of Cloth of Gold was months in the actual construction and making. Just like our modern Society Wars, thousands of people traveled great distances to attend. It all lasted roughly two weeks or in this case officially from June 7th until June 24th, 1520.

In reading through the actual accounts, one finds many instances of common activities to both our current Society wars and the 1520 Field of Cloth of Gold. Here are some passages of these various activities:

Tents, Pavilions, and Constructions

"FRAUNCES the Frenche kyng was with all his nobles of the realme of Fraunce, come to the toune of Arde, whiche was prepared for his commynge, many tentes, hales and pavilions, were set and pight in the felde." [Hall]

"Persons who have been to Calais tell wonders of the English pomp, and of the King's tent measuring some 6,000 yards (auric) of cloth of gold, and exceeding that of his Majesty here, which cost about 150,000 ducats or more." [Calendar of state papers; hereafter CSP]

"The tent of the King our lord is a magnificent affair (una grandisavnM cosa.). From the ground to its summit, on which is a gigantic St. Michael, it measures 60 paces (sessanta passi); the poles which support it are tall masts lashed together to increase their length, which is such tliat it would certainly suffice for a ship of 400 butts. The diameter of this tent in its centre (in fondo) is sixteen paces, and all round it is a corridor, eight paces broad and some 20 paces in length." [CSP]

For Henry the VIII, a palace rivaling Whitehall:

"...on the playne grene was buylded a fountayne of enbowed worke, gylte with fine golde, and bice, ingrayled with anticke workes, the olde God of wyne called Baccus birlyng the wyne, whiche by the conduyctes in therth ranne to all people plenteously with red, white, and claret wyne, over whose hedde was writen in letters of Romayn in gold, faicte bonne chere quy vouldra." [Hall]

"Could I describe the fortress-house raised at Guisnes by the King of England for his banquet (festino), you would be surprised to hear of its architecture, but you would be more delighted to behold such a structure, built to last a day, and no longer. It appears to be that which it is not, and it is that which it does not appear to be." [CSP]

"The house of the King of England covered four square acres. Outside the gates were two columns, one on each side; on one the God of Love, on the other "G'arihl" [Hospitality?], most admirably wrought, with a Bacchus on a fountain, which on the day of the banquet spouted wine." [CSP]

"Throughout the building, at a distance of two feet below the windows, is a handsome gilt cornice whereon to hang the tapestries, which are all most magnificent." [CSP]

"I have seen a temporary house built by him, said to have cost 100,000 francs, the handsomest ever beheld; never did I see so beautiful or so costly a palace. The [French] King's tent is a stupendous sight." [CSP]

"On either side there are stages on which the ladies and ever} body will be placed to see the entertainments, which will commence on Monday the llth instant, and will last some eight or ten days. The jousters on both sides, some 220 men-at-arms in all, are in excellent condition." [CSP]

Delays

It is said that this palace will be completed on Thursday, or thereabouts...[CSP]

"where are also a great number of other tents, the English also having pitched their tents outside Guisnes, but ours [the French] are the handsomer. Altogether they will amount to some 2,000; and they are still in the act of putting them up." [CSP]

Fanciest of dress

Regarding HRM Francis: "The King wore a cap of black velvet with feathers of the same colour, and some large jewels in it very well set, which the King estimates at 2,000 ducats. His doublet was embroidered with gold knots, the shirt protruding from the slashes, the tags of which were most beautiful jewels. His breast was bare, and he had sleeves (manegetti). Over the doublet was a cloak of cloth of gold embroidered; at the back of the cloak a certain bit of cloth of gold slashed, looking like a half cape, or well nigh a half mantle, fastened over the left shoulder, which half cape or mantle was costly and ornamented with large jewels. On his legs, he wore white boots (burza- chini bianchi).[CSP]

"The King of England wore a very handsome and costly doublet of cloth of silver, with a girdle and apron (traversd) or "sbarra" from the cincture to the shoulder, of cloth of gold studded with very beautiful jewels, and a black velvet cap with jewels and black feathers; and he rode a very handsome bay courser with a "trapper "t embroidered in gold." [CSP]

"To tel you the apparel of the ladies, their rych attyres, their sumptuous Juelles, their diversities of beauties, and the goodly behavyor from day to day syth the first meting, I assure you ten mennes wyttes can scace declare it." [Hall]

Music

"Then up blewe the Trumpettes, Sagbuttes, Clarions, and all other Minstrelles on bothe sides," [Hall]

Jousting

"The jousts will commence on Monday or Tuesday, and will last about 10 days." [CSP]

On the morrow, the 11th, the jousts commenced, and were attended by both the Queens, with a very great number of most noble ladies, all vieing with each other in beauty and ornamented apparel, and for love of them each of the jousters endeavoured to display his valour and prowess, in order to find more favour with his sweetheart. And thus did they assemble daily to witness sword-fighting on horseback and on foot, and other tournaments and representations of war. [CSP]

"All, owing to the wind, did very ill, and an infinity of spears were lost, but they continued tilting until evening." [CSP]

but also fighting on foot

"Fryday the xxii. daye of June in the campe was set a barrier for to fyght on foote," [Hall]

Feasting and Dancing

"The King of France dined in the palace with the Queen of England. They were seated at the centre of the table opposite to each other under a costly canopy. ... The viands were more dainty and exquisite than can be told, and their description is therefore omitted. Constantly during dinner the most excellent vocal and instrumental music was heard; a better performance was not possible. In the other halls a number of Lords and Princes who had accompanied the most Christian King dined, and after dinner there was a ball until night, the King himself dancing, and part of the time he made love to the ladies there. [CSP]

[Note the phrase "and their description is therefore omitted" as to the foods served. As usual, no one bothered to record exactly what dishes were eaten.]

Of this feast Hall writes: "he was ryght honorably served in all thinges nedefull, for Forestes, Parkes, felde, salte seas, Ryvers, Moates and Pondes, wer serened and sought through countreies for the delicacie of viandes, wel was that man rewarded that could bring any thinge of likinge or pleasure: Ryght honorably was the French kynge entertained."

Exchange of Gifts

"The kynge of England gave to the Frenche kynge a colloure of Jewels of precyouse stoones ... The Frenche kynge gave to the Kynge of Englande a Bracelet of precyouse stones, riche Jewels and fayre..." [Hall]

Other Activities

"During this triumph so much people of Picardie and West Flaunders drew to Guysnes to se the kyng of England and his honor, to whom vitailes of the court were in plentie, the conduicte of the gate ranne wyne alwayes, there wer vacaboundes, plowmen, laborers and of the bragery wagoners and beggers that for drunkennes lay in routes and heapes,

so great resort thether came, that both knightes and ladies that were come to se the noblenes, were fayne to lye in hay and strawe, and helde theim therof hyghly pleased." [Hall]

Weatherwise

"Today, the 13th, it blows a terrible gale, and as the Kings were unable to joust, they went to the lists to see some Bretons and Englishmen wrestle." [CSP]

"Today, although the wind was high, and the weather bad.." [CSP]

"Towards evening it commenced raining, and all went to disarm..." [CSP]

"The French King's tent was pitched outside the walls of Ardres, near his dwelling house. The tent and pavilions remained up four days only, on account of the wind and rain, so that it became necessary to strike them, to the very great regret of the most Christian King and of all the French nobility, as they were the pride of France; who thus counterbalanced the English pride generated by the house above described." [CSP]

"Monday the xviii. daye of June, there blewe such stormes of wind and wether that marvaill was to hear, for whiche hideous tempest som said it was a very pronosticacion of trouble and hatred to come betwene princes." [Hall]

As can be seen from these passages, the Field of Cloth of Gold was perhaps the fanciest and largest of the international summit meetings or royal expos of its time or any time with pomp and pageantry to spare. While it was most flamboyant, there was a concerted attempt to preserve equality between the sides. Neither was supposed to "overshine" the other.

How did it differ from our modern events? Did it include shopping? Probably not as we know it today; much of the procuring went on for months before hand and massive quantities of materials and victuals were brought to the site. Our Society Wars by contrast includes families with children; children are not mentioned in the accounts of 1520. And sanitation wise the accounts don't talk about the latrines or chamber pots, which would have stood instead of the more familiar modern porta-potties. In the end, who can read these accounts and not smile knowingly when they encounter the passages about delays or the weather.

What did it all mean? In terms of peace and diplomacy, the good feelings didn't last. Henry soon sided with King Charles of Spain against France. Perhaps Charles Whibley sums it up best when he says "But the culmination of glory and splendour was the Field of the Cloth of Gold, whereon Henry and Francis took the sound advice of Comines, whose maxim it was that princes should not meet, except to share their pleasures." Not a bad maxim for these current wars either.

On Our English Dogs by Johnnae Ilyn Lewis, CE

There is no countrie that may (as I take it) compare with ours, in number, excellencie, and diuersitie of dogs. William Harrison. 1587

There is no doubt that we cherish and often write about our pet dogs today, but what did the writers say about dogs in the past? Thinking it might prove interesting, here's a selection of short passages from Elizabethan texts that reflect on the matters of dogs.

Of Our English Dogs and Their Qualities

In like sort we have of water spaniels in their kind. The third sort of dogs of the gentle kind, is the spaniell gentle, or comforter, or (as the common terme is) the fistinghound, and those are called Melitei, of the Iland Malta, from whence they were brought hither. These are little and prettie, proper and fine, and sought out far and néere to satisfie the nice delicacie of daintie dames, and wanton womens willes; instruments of follie to plaie and dallie withall, in trifling away the treasure of time, ... These Sybariticall pup | pies, the smaller they be (and thereto if they have an hole in the foreparts of their heads) the better they are accepted, the more pleasure also they provoke, as méet plaiefellowes for minsing mistresses to beare in their bosoms, to keepe companie withall in their chambers, to succour with sléepe in bed, and nourish with meat at boord, to lie in their laps, and licke their lips as they lie (like yoong Dianaes) in their wagons and coches. And good reason it should be so... Holinshed, Raphael and William Harrison page 230

Dogs of the homelie kind, are either shepheards curs, or mastiffes. The first are so common, that it néedeth me not to speake of them. Holinshed, Raphael and William Harrison page 230

The last sort of dogs consisteth of the currish kind méet for manie toies: of which the whappet or prickeard curre is one. Some men call them warners, bicause they are good for nothing else but to barke and giue warning when anie bodie dooth stirre or lie in wait about the house in the night season. ... The second sort of them are called turne spits, whose office is not vnknowne to anie. And as these are onelie reserved for this purpose, so in manie places our mastiffes (beside the vse which tinkers have of them in carieng their heavie budgets) are made to draw water in great whéeles out of déepe wels, going much like vnto those which are framed for our turne spits, as is to be séene at Roiston, where this feat is often practised. Holinshed, Raphael and William Harrison page 231

Holinshed, Raphael and William Harrison, et al. The first and second volumes of Chronicles comprising: The description and historie of England... 1587.

John Caius in his 1576 Of Englishe dogges the diuersities, the names, the natures, and the properties described certain dogs and their attributes with the following words:

Of the Dogge called a Harier, in Latine Leuerarius.

THat kinde of Dogge whom nature hath indued with the vertue of smelling, whose property it is to vse a lustines, a readines, and a couragiousnes in hunting, and draweth into his nostrells the ayre or sent of the beast pursued and followed...

Of the Dogge called a Terrar, in Latine Terrarius.

ANother sorte there is which hunteth the Foxe and the Badger or Greye onely, whom we call Terrars, because they (after the manner and custome of ferrets in searching for Connyes) créepe into the grounde, and by that meanes make afrayde, nyppe, and byte the Foxe and the Badger in such sort, that eyther they teare

them in péeces with theyr téeth beyng in the bosome of the earth, or else hayle and pull them perforce out of their lurking angles, darke dongeons, and close cause...

Of the Dogge called a Bloudhounde in Latine Sanguinarius.

The greater sort which serue to hunt, having lippes of a large syze, & eares of no small lenght, doo, not onely chase the beast whiles it liueth, (as the other doo of whom mencion aboue is made) but beyng dead also by any maner of casualtie, make recourse to the place where it lyeth, having in this poynt an assured and infallible guyde, namely, the sent and sauour of the bloud sprinckled héere and there vpon the ground.

Of the Dogge called the Gasehounde, in Latine Agasaeus.

This kinde of Dogge which pursueth by the eye, preuayleth little, or neuer a whit, by any benefite of the nose that is by smelling, but excelleth in perspicuitie and sharpenesse of sight altogether, by the vertue whereof, being singuler and notable, it hunteth the Foxe and in the Hare.

Of the Dogge called the Grehounde, in Latine Leporarius.

There is another kinde of Dogge which for his incredible swiftnesse is called Leporarius a Grehounde, because the principall seruice of them dependent and consistent in starting and hunting the hare, which Dogges likewyse are indued with no lesse strength then lightnes in maintenance of the game, in seruing the chase, in taking the Bucke, the Harte, the Dowe, the Foxe, and other beastes of semblable kinde ordained for the game of hunting.

Of the Dogge called the Leuiner, or Lyemmer in Latine Lorarius.

ANother sort of dogges be there, in smelling singuler, and in swiftnesse incomparable. This is (as it were) a myddle kinde betwixt the Harier and the Grehounde, as well for his kinde, as for the frame of his body.... This Dogge for the excellency of his conditions, namely smelling and swift running, doth followe the game with more eagernes, and ta|keth the pray with a iolly quicknes.

Of the Dogge called a Tumbler, in Latine Vertagus.

This sorte of Dogges, which compasseth all by craftes, fraudes, subtelties and deceiptes, we Englishe men call Tumblers, because in hunting they turne and tumble, winding their bodyes about in circle wise, and then fearcely and violently venturing vpon the beast, doth soddenly gripe it, at the very entrance and mouth of their receptacles, or closets before they can recouer meanes, to saue and succour themselues.

Of the Dogge called the theeuishe Dogge in Latine Canis furax.

The like to that whom we have rehearsed, is the théeuishe Dogge, which at the mandate and bydding of his master fléereth and leereth abroade in the night, hunting Connyes by the ayre, which is leuened with their sauour and conveyed to the sense of smelling by the meanes of the winde blowing towardes him. ...The farmers of the countrey and vplandishe dwellers, call this kinde of Dogge a nyght curre, because he hunteth in the darke.

Of gentle Dogges seruing the hauke, and first of the Spaniell, called in Latine Hispaniolus.

The common sort of people call them by one generall word, namely Spaniells.

The Dogge called the Setter, in Latine Index.

ANother sort of Dogges be there, seruiceable for fowling, making no noise either with foote or with tounge, whiles they followe the game. ... when he hath founde the byrde, he kéepeth sure and fast silence, he stayeth his steppes and wil procéede no further, and with a close, couert, watching eye, layeth his belly to the grounde and so créepeth forward like a worme. When he approcheth néere to the place where the birde is, he layes him downe, and with a marcke of his pawes betrayeth the place of the byrdes last abode...

Of the Dogge called the water Spaniell, or finder in Latine Aquaticus seu Inquisitor.

THat kinde of Dogge whose seruice is required in fowling vpon the water, partly through a naturall towardnesse, and partly by diligent teaching, is indued with that property. This sort is somewhat bigge, and of a measurable greatnesse, having long, rough, and curled heare...

Of the delicate, neate, and pretty kind of dogges called the Spaniel gentle or the comforter, in Latine Melitaeus or Fotor.

There is, besides those which wée haue already deliuered, another sort of gentle dogges in this our Englishe soyle ... These dogges are litle, pretty, proper, and fyne, and sought for to satisfie the delicatenesse of daintie dames, and wanton womens

In latine Canis Laniarius in Englishe the Butchers Dogge.

So called for the necessity of his vse, for his seruice affoordeth great benefite to the Butcher as well in following as in taking his cattell when néede constraineth, vrgeth, and requireth. This kinde of dogge is likewise called, In latine Molossicus or Molossus.

Of the Dogge called Turnespete in Latine Veruuersator.

There is comprehended, vnder the curres of the coursest kinde, a certaine dogge in kytchen seruice excellent. For when any meate is to be roasted they go into a wheele which they turning rounde about with the waight of their bodies, so diligently looke to their businesse, that no drudge nor skullion can doe the feate more cunningly. Whom the popular sort herevpon call Turnespets, being the last of all those which we have first mencioned.

Of the Dogge called the Daunser, in Latine Saltator or Tympanista.

There be also dogges among vs of a mungrell kind which are taught and exercised to daunce in measure at the musicall sounde of an instrument, as, at the iust stroke of the drombe, at the sweete accent of the Cyterne, & tuned strings of the harmonious Harpe showing many pretty trickes by the gesture of their bodies. As to stand bolte vpright, to lye flat vpon the grounde, to turne rounde as a ringe holding their tailes in their téeth, to begge for theyr meate,

And in conclusion we turn to the words that Edward Topsell published in 1607:

For as shall be manifested more at large, there are Dogges very great, some for hunting, some for Warre and defence, some for the Bore, Bull, or Bear, some for the Hare, Cony, or Hedge-hog: againe some are smaller which are called Hounds, Braches, Beagles, Shepheardes Dogges, House-curres, Spagnels both for the Water and Land: and some foysting Dogges for the pleasure of the rich. Page 137

Notes and Links on Summer Food Safety By THL Johnnae Ilyn Lewis, CE

With the summer season rapidly approaching, and the event calendar filling up with numerous outdoor events, the need to dine out doors is again upon us. Be it camping, a contributed dish potluck or a grill session after a combat melee practice, the summer season demands recipes suitable for the outdoors.

The adage that one often hears is: Hot food hot; cold food cold but what does this saying mean in practical terms and how does someone not inadvertently poison his or her family, household or the royal luncheon? In this case it means hold hot foods above 140° F and cold foods below 40° F. It turns out food borne illnesses really do peak during the warm summer months. The following Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) guide titled Foodborne Illness & Disease

http://www.fsis.usda.gov/FactSheets/Foodborne_Illness_Peaks_in_Summer/index.asp explains that by observing food preparation many of these illnesses can be avoided. Such simple steps as: 1. Clean: Wash Hands and Surfaces Often; 2. Separate: Don't Cross-Contaminate; 3. Cook: Cook to Proper Temperatures; and 4. Chill: Refrigerate Promptly will prevent many outbreaks.

A number of these very helpful and very user-friendly FSIS guides can be used and even understood without a requisite degree in Nutrition or Food Sciences. One way to locate this information is to use the handy informative Gateway to Government Food Safety Information at: www.foodsafety.gov

The USDA also offers a number of these guidelines, which are updated as new information becomes available. It makes sense therefore to keep checking back from time to time to see what has been changed. For instance in 2006, it was announced that "For safety, when cooking poultry, use a food thermometer to check the internal temperature. Poultry should reach a safe minimum internal temperature of 165 °F throughout the product." This is actually a reduction from the 180° F, which was the previous advice. Allow more cooking time on cold or windy days, or at higher altitudes, and less in extremely hot weather. This is good basic advice when adjusting cooking times. http://www.weber.com/

Cooperative Home Extension is not what it used to be before the draconian budget cuts, and may not exist at all in the near future should there be more cuts. 
