

The fools of April by THL Johnnae Ilyn Lewis, CE

April is a shortened form of Aprilus, which comes from *aperire*, meaning "to open." If March was known for changeable weather, April today is associated with showers, Shakespeare, Chaucer's pilgrims, and of course fools. Accounts vary as to when April Fool's day was first observed as a day for 'fool's errands,' pranks, and lies. Despite being studied extensively, starting in the late 19th century, Alan Dundes in his article "April Fool and April Fish" notes a century "of scholarship has unfortunately added very little to our knowledge and understanding of this curious custom" of April and fools.

Dundes suggests there may be a 1508 French source or perhaps it's a 1618 German source. He writes, "...ultimate origins are almost always impossible to ascertain definitely." (Biblical connections to the Passion of Christ and His Mocking or to Noah and the dove are especially suspect, as is any association with the Hindu Festival of Holi in India.) Other scholars feel the custom originated with a calendar change. In the late sixteenth century, France moved the New Year's from March 25th to January 1st. People failing to observe the new calendar would be April Fools. What is known is that the traditional French method of celebrating the day is the *poisson d'Avril* or the *pesce d'Aprile* (the April fish) where someone is either hoaxed or has a paper fish attached to his back. There are dozens of explanations as to the origins of the French games or activities, but none are definitive.

Other authors associate April Fool's Day or All Fools' Day to just the coming of spring, following the Spring equinox. Spring brings warm weather after winter and is a season open to mirth and merriment and falling as it often does during the season of Lent, that brings all the more reason to celebrate something both mocking and jocular. What is fairly certain is that the first of April was not celebrated as a Fool's Day from 'time immemorial' as some would like nor can it be dated to medieval times. There were occasions when fools were celebrated, most notably 12th Night with the Lords and Ladies of Misrule, "Abbots of Unreason," Feasts of Fools or Feasts of Asses, etc. but these occasions for foolishness were not generally connected with April.

Under "April's Fool Day" the *Oxford English Dictionary* includes the following early quotations. Both date from 1592 and come from Greene's *Upstart Courtier*. The quotations are: "Two pert april esquires; the one had a murrey cloth gowne on. (Malh.) II. 247" and "That time when the cuckold's chorister began to bewray April Gentlemen with his never changed notes." Note that the described men are esquires or gentlemen and not fools in these instances. A search in *Early English Books Online (EEBO)* yielded this mention of a festival of All Fools dating from the year 1600. Tomaso Garzoni's *The hospitall of incurable fooles* says "and that especially which is performed on the festival day of *all Fooles*, as the Romaines were accustomed, the Author desireth." The day or month though is not specified.

A more telling phrase is found in John Aubrey's *Remaines of Gentilisme and Judaisme*, dating from 1686-87. Aubrey writes, "Fooles holy day. We observe it on ye first of April. And so it is kept in Germany everywhere." Miles Prance in 1684 had described in his *A Postscript to the Observators First Volume* that "the first of April (the day Fools are wont to be sent on Errands)." If Aubrey and Prance are correct, the supposition is the custom of April Fools reached England sometime in the mid seventeenth century and became quite popular, perhaps in response to the prohibitions of the Commonwealth. (Oddly enough, there's no information easily found about what the early practices or customs were in Germany.) By the late 17th century, we know that it was being celebrated in England in ways that famously involved fools, errands, and cuckolds and even sleeve-less errands. By 1692, Congreve writes in *The Old Bachelour*, "What, has he been here? that's one of Loves April-fools, is always upon some errand that's to no purpose, ever embarking in Adventures." The 1699 *A New Dictionary of the Canting Crew* by B.E. contained this definition "Sleeveless-errand, such as Fools are sent on, the first of April."

In the eighteenth century the activities exploded with a number of recorded regional variations. There were April noddies, a noddy being a fool or simpleton or an April gabby, again a gaby, gabby, or gabey being a foolish fellow. Fools' errands might be called hunting the gowk or cuckoo. In Scotland it became a day of going on useless errands, a cuckoo or April Gowk day, and a day of jocular but harmless tricks. In Cumberland, Westmorland, Lancashire, and even Yorkshire, the fun became associated with May first with "May Goslings" being the equivalent of April Fools. By the way, the still popular childhood April Fools' custom of telling someone that his or her shoes are untied may be traced back to a more ancient custom of telling someone that a shoe is unbuckled. *The Every-day Book and Table Book* of 1826-1827 cites this as being a custom already some thirty years old or dating back to the late 1700s.

We also know that by 1760, April First was being recorded as "the merriest day in the year in England" according to the *Spectator*. *Poor Robin's Almanac*, also in 1760, carried this ditty:

"The first of April, some do say, Is set apart for All Fools' Day. But why the people call it so, Nor I, nor they themselves do know. But on this day are people sent On purpose for pure merriment."

If we cannot document the mirth and merriment of the April Fool as being appropriately pre-1600, we can still celebrate April with the works of two other great men associated with the month. Generations of English students and scholars associate the month of April of course with both Chaucer and Shakespeare. Chaucer begins *The Canterbury Tales* with the immortal words:

"Whan that aprill with his shoures soote. The droghte of march hath perced to the roote... Thanne longen folk to goon on pilgrimages." The month is also forever associated with Shakespeare. The exact date of his birth is actually unknown, but it has been given for centuries as April 23, 1564 with his death occurring on that same day April 23rd in 1616. Of April, Shakespeare wrote:

"The April's in her eyes; it is love's spring, And these, the showers to bring it on. Be cheerful." *Antony and Cleopatra*. Act III. Sc. ii.

"Oh! How spring of love resembleth
The uncertain glory of an April Day
Which now shows all the beauty of the sun,
And by and by a cloud takes all away!"
The Two Gentlemen of Verona. Act I Sc. Iii.

And lastly, this special sentiment for the month, from *The Merchant of Venice*. Act II. Sc. ix.

"A day in April never came so sweet."

And with that sentiment we shall end this brief discussion.



Períod Cooking: "Lent and Spring fare" Contributed by THL Johnnae Ilyn Lewis

As I sit writing this, Mardi Gras is just a day off. The parades and other activities are well underway in New Orleans. In the Polish enclave of Hamtramack, Michigan, the *paczki* are frying traditionally in lard (and only lard), before being stuffed with creams and fruits ranging from cherries to lemon to the favored prune mixture. Think extra-enriched jelly doughnuts but more substantial and at least three times bigger. After Fat Tuesday come Ash Wednesday and Lent. This period known as Lent begins in February or early March. It may begin as early as February 4th when Easter is as early as March 22nd or it may be as late as March 10th when Easter falls on April 25th. In 2015 Ash Wednesday falls on February 18th. Easter in 2015 is April 5th.

"Lent carries particular significance in the study of medieval and Renaissance customs. Lent was seen as the period of time when believers prepared themselves for the Holy Week. During this time people repented, prayed, gave alms, and fasted. Originally Lent required the eating of only one meal a day, that being taken after vespers or in the evening. What was eaten during Lent varied from place to place and over the centuries, there were modifications. Quite often the rule of one meal a day taken in the evening might be relaxed and the meal taken at two or three o'clock in the afternoon or midday. The Emperor Charlemagne took his Lenten meal during midday after an early saying of vespers, and many others followed that practice.

Prohibited foods in the early Christian period included wine, fish, meat, eggs, and the *whitemeats* or dairy products of milk, cheese and butter. The ban on fish was lifted early on. St. Gregory writing to St. Augustine of England in the sixth century wrote, "We abstain from flesh meat, and from all things that come from flesh, as milk, cheese, and eggs." Later, it was still common during Holy Week, or at least on Good Friday to eat only a diet of dry food, bread, salt, and vegetables. Dispensations or excemptions were also granted. In medieval Germany, these purchased excemptions to eat eggs and butter on fast days were known as the *Butterbriefe*. The churches profited from their sale of dispensations; one of the steeples of the cathedral at Rouen was even known as the *Tour Buerre* or Butter Tower.(1)"

So what recipes specify or mention Lent and spring? How was it managed when the diet switched from meat and dairy being allowed to the more limited diet of the late wintertime? Here are some recipes that mention Lent

This dish indicates it is for "peascods" but please note that are fashioned only to look like "peascods."

To make peascods in Lent.

TAke Figs, Kaisons, and a few Dates and beate them verie fine, and season it with Cloues, Mace, Sinamom and Ginger, and for your paste séeth faire water and Oyle in a dish vpon coales, put therein saffron and salt and a litle flowre, fashion them then like peascods, and when ye will serue them, frye them in Oyle in a frying panne, but let the Oyle be verie hote, and the firesoft for burning of them, and when yee make, them for flesh dayes, take a fillet of veale and mince it fine, and put the yolkes of two or thrée raw egges to it, and season it with pepper, salt, cloues, mace, honie, suger, sinamom,

ginger small raisons, or great minced, and for your paste, butter, the yolke of an egge, and season them, and frye them in butter as ye did the other in Oyle.

Dawson, Thomas. The Good Husvvifes ievvell. 1587

The following recipes come from the late Elizabethan volume *A Booke of Cookerie, otherwise called the Good Huswiues Handmaid*. The work was published in 1597. First, a recipe for pastry:

To make short paste in Lent.

TAke thick almond milke séething hot, & so wet your flower with it: & sallet oyle fried, & saffron, and so miggle your paste altogether, and that will make good paste.

These next two recipes call for fresh eel.

How to make Chewets in Lent.

TAke a fresh Eele and flea it, and cut of the fish from the bone, mince it smal and pare two or three wardens and mince them likewise small, as much of them as of the Eele or Oysters, and temper them together, and season it with Ginger, Pepper, cloues, Mace and salte, and a little colour it with Saunders, and put currans and prunes, and minced great raisons and Dates, as you do to the other pies of flesh, when it is halfe baked put them out, and put to it a little vergious: and if your Gelly be not fat put to it a little Sallet Oyle fried with some sweet flowers or hearbes, if yee put a lyttle Rosewater and salt it is good, but if you haue any fat of fish it is better then oyle.

How to make a pie in Lent.

TAke Eeles and flea them, and cut them from the bone, take Wardens and Figs, & mince them together, and put to them Cloues and mace, pepper, salt, and Saffron, and season al these together, and mingle it with great and small Raisons, Prunes and Dates, cut it in small peeces, and so put it into the coffin, and let it bake halfe an houre.

Three custards:

How to make a Custard in Lent.

TAke halfe a pound of almonds, blanch them and beate them in a morter. Then take a quart of fair water, warm it luke warme, and strayne your liquour with the almonds. Then take a peece of the spawn of a Pike, of a Carp or a Roch, and beat it in a morter, then straine it into your almonds: for lacke of spawne yee may take two spoonfuls of the flower of Rice, and put it into your almonds Then take Sugar, cloues, Maces, Saffron and salt, and season your liquor therwith, euen as ye would season a custard of creame, then take three handful of fine flower, and almost a pint of fair water boyling hot, and a litle Saffron, and make your paste therwith. Then make your custard and when it is made, put small Raisons and Dates in the bottome of your Custarde, as you do vnto a custard of creame.

How to make a Custard in Lent.

TAke the milt of any maner of fresh fish, and a little of the milt of a white Hering, and a quantitie of blanched almonds, and crums of bread, and mingle al these together and a litle Water and Sugar, and a quantitie of Rosewater, and mingle that together: season it as ye would do another custard with al maner of spices. Then mingle therwith Raisons corrans, and Dates, cut in peeces, and so bake it in a platter or paste, whether ye will, the space of halfe an houre, and so serue it in.

Another way to make a Custard in Lent.

Take blanched almonds and bray them smal put crummes of white bread in the braying of the almonds. Then let a Pike be sodden, or fat Eels, that ye may haue the best of the broth and put that in the bottom of your platter, put in also minced dates and corrans. Then strain your almonds with the water sodden with sugar. Then season it with sugar, saffron, cloues and Mace: then put in all the stuffe in the platter, and so boyle it vppon a chafingdish a good while: sée the platter be not couered, for if it be the Custard will neuer waxe harde: when ye serue it forth, cast Sugar on it, & if your dates and corrans be sodden in the fish broth afore ye put them in the platter, they wil be the better, put to a litle salt in the making, &c.

And lastly how....

To make Egs in Lent.

TAke Hennes Egges, and put out cleane the white and the yolke. Then wash your shel clean, and take almond milk, and séeth it with Isanglas, or of the broth of a Pike or a Tench, and when it is sodden, take it off, but before yée take it from the fire, ye must season it with sugar and salt, and fill your egge shels before the milke be cold. Then make a hole in the Egge aboue, and cut out so much of the white as yee wil make your yolks, then colour your mylke that he left afore with Saffron, like the yolk of an egge, and fill vp the hole againe therewith, and let it stand til it be occupied.

To make meat of floure, and how it is sodden or dressed.

The floure is to bee boiled in good Caponbroth or other flesh, and it must bee put into the broth by little and by little, stirring it alwaies with a spoone, and boile it the space of half an houre vpon the coales with a soft fire, that it smell not of the smoke, then dish it and cast chéese and spice vpon it. In Lent boile it in Almond milke, Sugar, and Rosewater.

The 1598 cookery book titled *Epulario*, or *The Italian banquet* offers a chapter titled "The

third Booke: Shewing how to dresse fish, hearbs, and many other things in Lent time."

Here we find the following recipes.

To make tenne messe of white meat in Lent.

TAke a pound and a halfe of blanched Almonds and stampe them, and the crums of a white loafe stéeped in broth of white pease. If you haue no pease broth, you may séeth ye breadin water for the space of halfe an houre, making it soft, the□ take some good sea fish or Pike (taken out of the riuer) sodden, then take halfe a pound of the white meat of the fish, and stampe it with the Almonds, sodden bread, a litle broth, and the iuice of Orenges, if you haue no Orenges take Veriuice, with some Rosewater, and half a pound of cleane white Ginger, and halfe a pound of sugar, all these tempered together and strained, you shall set them to séeth in a pipkin with a soft fire for the space of half a quarter of an houre, and let it not smell of the smoke, but stirre it often.

To seeth Rice pottage in Lent.

Take a pound of blanched Almonds, and a pound of rice washed twise or thrise in luke warme water, and set them on the fire in cleare water, make it séeth as is aforesaid in the second chapter of meat made of Rice, but you shal not séeth it with flesh broth.

To make broth of pease.

You may seeth pease likewise with Almond milk in Lent time as aforesaid.

To make Gealie in a little basket.

Prepare the decoction in good order, then take a new basket and put the Capon, Pullet, or other flesh into it, that you would put in Gealie as in a platter, you must likewise haue another vessell ready wherein you may put the basket, putting the foresaid decoction vpon it, and set it in a cold place to congeale, and when it is well congealed take a whote knife, and raise the Gealie round about within the basket that it may easily come out, and make cleane the vessel with a cloth in euery place, and so you may carry this Gealy whether you will. The like you may do in Lent, putting whole fish into it, which shall séeme aliue, and it will be very faire.

To make fritters of Sage and Bay-leaues.

Take a little fine flower and temper it with Egges, Sugar, Sinamon, Pepper, and a little Saffron to make it yellow, and take whole sage leaues and roule them in this composition one by one, and frie them in Butter or Suet. Do the like with Bayleaues, and in Lent frie them in oyle without Egges and Suet.

To make Pancakes in Lent, and first of Elder floures.

Take Almonds and stampe them, or else Pine apple kernels, and straine them with Rosewater and Pease broth, then take a little leauen, floures of Elders, and some flower, and temper them together, and this would bee made ouer night against morning, and so they will be the lighter: in the morning put good store of Sugar on them, and make them in what forme you will, and fry them in Oyle.

Happy Springtime everyone. (The sixteen inches of snow in the front yard will melt

eventually or so I tell myself and under there are blooms and blossoms and flowers still to come. Maybe by June. [editor's note: we Altavians can only dream of such snowy weather!]





Period Cooking: Cookery in Spring

Contributed by THL Johnnae llyn Lewis

Having previously examined recipes which mention Lenten fare, one might move along to look for recipes which specify spring. Here are a few English recipes mentioning the season.

Spring flowers feature in our nursery rhymes and sayings today; they also can be found scattered in our culinary references. John Partridge in his 1573 *The Treasurie of Commodious Conceits*, includes a chapter titled "To know what time in the yeare Herbes and Flowres, should be gathered in their full strength. cap.lxi." Therein he explains when herbs and flowers should be gathered. He writes:

"Camimamill shalbe gathered in Apryll... Addertung should be gathered in Apryll.

Uiolet should be gathered in the Month of March, & in this month should Uiolets be put into Sugre and to Syrop.

Roses should be gathered in April and in May: and of them shoulde be made Suger ro set in Syropes of Roses and in this same Month should Oyle be made of Camamyll.

Rosemary flowres should be gathered in May. Centory whe he begieth to flowre.

Origanum in ye Month of Iune.

And as to what might be done with those roses gathered in May and June, he writes:

"Here foloweth, the sundrie Uertues of Roses, for dyuers Medicines. Ca.lxii.

ROses, be colde and moyste, in two degrees: it hath these Uertues. Stampe it, & lay it to a sore that brenneth & aketh: and it shall cease both the brennyng & akyng.

Also, it is good for the feuer in the stomacke, & against all euyelles that are gendred in hot humours.

Also, lette any woman drynke it with Wyne, and it shal foorthwith restrayne bleedyngs, and helpe the Marowes of the wombe.

Also, make Oyle of Roses, & that is a principall Receipt for pricking in Sinewes & the water threof is good for sore eien, and for hot euils, and the Oyle is good for head ache to anoynte therwith the timples, and ye roote of him is good, & drawynge for Iron: or other thing in a man's foote, & the red Rose is much better then the white."

Partridge, John. The Treasurie of Commodious Conceits, and Hidden Secretes. 1573.**

Here is another recipe for a dish to be made of all those gathered herbs. From 1598 comes this recipe:

To make a Herboletta of hearbes in the month of May.

Take as much new chéefe as aforesaid and stampe it, then take fiftéene or sixtéene Egges and some milke, good store of Bettonie, Margerum, Sage, Mint, and a little Parsely, stampe these hearbes very well and wring out the iuice and straining it, you must put it into the Chéefe and other things aforesaid, with halfe a pound of Butter, halfe a pound of Ginger, and ten ounces of Sugar, and mixe all these together and set them on the fire in a pipkin not ouerwhote, and stirre it with a spoone vntill it begin to thicken like pottage: that done, hauing made paste you shall put the composition into it, and set it to bake in a pan with a soft fire, both vnder and ouer it. And when it is well baked, take it out and straw fine Sugar and Rosewater vpon it. This kinde of Tarte is best when it is gréenest.

[Rosselli, Giovanne de.] *Epulario, or The Italian banquet*. 1598.

In the 1597 *The Second Part of the Good Hus-wives Iewell*, Thomas Dawson advocated that one confite orange peels "cheefly in May."

To confite Orenge peeles which may be doone at all times in the yeere, and cheefly in May, because then the saide peeles be greatest and thickest.

TAke thicke Orenge péeles, and them cut in foure or fiue péeces, and steepe them in water the space of ten or twelue daies. You may know when they be stéeped enough, if you holde them vp in the sunne and sée through them, then they be steeped enough, & you cannot sée through them, then let them stéepe vntil you may. Then lay them to drye vpon a table, and put them to dry betwéen two linnen clothes, then put them in a Kettell or vessell leaded, and adde to it as much Honny as will halfe couer the saide peeles, more or lesse as you think good, boyle them a little and stirre them alwaies, then take them from the fire, least the Honny should séeth ouermuch. For if it should boyle a little more then it ought to boyle, it would be thick. Let it them stand and rest foure daies in the said Honny, stirring and mingling the Orrenge and Honny euery day together. Because there is not honny enough to couer all the saide Orrenge péeles, you must stir them well and oftentimes, thus doo thrée times, giuing them one bobling at ech time, then let them stand thrée dayes then strain them from the honny, and after you haue let them boile a small space, take them from the fier, and bestow them in vessels, putting to them Ginger, cloues and Sinamon, mixe all together, and the rest of the Sirrope will serue to dresse others withall.

Lastly, the agrarian writer Thomas Tusser offers this advice for April regarding the keeping of the dairy by the good housewife. He regarded the milking and making of cheeses and butter to be the sole province of the women of the house and chided them in a number of verses should they prove negligent or fail in these tasks.

From Aprill beginning, til Andrew be past,

so long with good huswife, her dayry doth last.

Good beast & good pasture, good husbands prouide

ye resdue, good huswiues, know best how to guide

Tusser, Thomas. Fine hundreth points of good husbandry vnited to as many of good huswiferie. 1573.


